Operation of Golf Carts on Tiki Island

- 1. Licensed driver
- 2. Slow Moving Emblem with reflective surface
- 3. D.O.T. approved operational head lamps
- 4. D.O.T. approved operational tail lamps
- 5. D.O.T. approved side reflectors
- 6. Rearview Mirror(s)
- 7. Operational parking brake
- 8. No driving on walking/bicycle lane on Tiki Dr.
- 9. Drive with the flow of traffic
- 11. Liability insurance (optional)
- 12. Children under the age of seven shall be restrained by either an adult or by a seatbelt.
- 13. Golf carts are prohibited from pulling trailers, boats, jet skis, other objects or people on public streets and the right of way.
- 14. Headlights shall be used at dark beginning 30 minutes before sunset and 30 minutes after sunrise.
- 15. Passengers shall be limited to designated seating capacity by manufacturer.
- 16. No one shall stand in or on the vehicle while it is in operation.
- 17. All golf carts shall be registered with the Village and have attached an annual registration sticker issued by the City upon payment of a \$25.00 registration fee.
- 18. All drivers of golf carts shall abide by all traffic regulations applicable to vehicular traffic when using the authorized streets.

Village of Tiki Island Ordinance 40-121-

Golf cart shall have the meaning assigned by V.T.C.A., Transportation Code § 502.001(7), as amended, and means a motor vehicle commonly referred to as a golf cart which must have a minimum of four wheels and has an attainable top speed not greater than 25 miles per hour on a paved level surface and which is manufactured primarily for transporting persons on a golf course and in compliance with those federal motor vehicle safety standards for low speed vehicles. Specifically excluded from this definition are those motorized conveyances commonly referred to as all-terrain vehicles (ATVs), off-road vehicles, four wheelers, mules, gators and design-altered golf carts which have been altered to allow them to travel at a speed greater than 25 miles per hour.

All traffic laws apply Day or Night. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a golf cart on a public street in violation of these provisions.

- the unlicensed and under-age drivers of golf carts
- and open container of alcohol in golf carts.

REGISTRATION STICKERS ARE REQUIRED TO BE PLACED EITHER ON THE FRONT WINDSHIELD OR THE FRONT COWLING OF THE CART.
